

## When your TV picture freezes during your favorite show, whom will you call?



As Americans invest billions buying digital TV sets to prepare for the digital transition, a few companies like Microsoft want the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to allow personal and portable unlicensed wireless devices to operate on television channels.

But FCC tests found that these devices can cause interference to digital television sets. With potentially millions of unlicensed devices operating on TV channels, interference can occur throughout a TV station's service area.

So while you watch your favorite show, the picture can freeze and the sound can go out – with no notice. And because these devices are not licensed, you can not track them down making the interference impossible to stop.

Congress and the FCC should not allow interference to jeopardize a successful transition to digital television. American consumers deserve and expect to have interference free digital television.
